- When it comes to the matter of capital expenditures, our goal is to balance the
 amenities designed to enhance quality-of-life and shareholder value with
 infrastructure maintenance...an investment that we hope will preempt more
 expensive repairs in the future.
 - In addition to the work mandated by the Local Law 11 inspection (which we have five years' to complete), a security fence on the northwest side of the building and upgrades to the elevator cabs—all of which are now in the works—the Board is considering a number of other capital projects, including a roof deck, improved front door access, a modest upgrade to the staff bathroom and redirecting the steam vent in the front of the building so that it's less attractive to homeless people.
