

BOARD NEWS

- The building's new mechanical engineer will be reviewing and documenting the building's mechanical systems and consulting on future installations, upgrades and modifications.
- The Board confirmed that homeowners' insurance—with minimum liability coverage of \$300,000 and \$250,000 for damage to property—is required of all shareholders. Approval of purchases, sublets and refis are conditional upon proof of coverage. In the case of a sublet, insurance is the responsibility of the shareholder/overtenant, who should require the subtenant to have renter's insurance.
- The building staff has been asked to remove dead plants and clean and mulch the tree pits on both the Gramercy Park South and Third Avenue sides of the building.
- The building will renew its membership in the Gramercy Park Block Association for 2012.
- The Board has authorized the purchase of an additional luggage cart.

- **UPDATE:** The Stand. Thanks to everyone who wrote a letter or trekked to Community Board 6's BASA Committee meeting last month regarding the application for a liquor license for The Stand, a comedy club being proposed for 239 Third Avenue (in the space formerly occupied by Proof and, subsequently, Truffle).
 - At the BASA meeting, the community voiced its concern about noise, smoking, litter, congestion and other crowd-related issues. However, following the applicants' very professional presentation and repeated assurances that they were planning a high-end restaurant/comedy club, not a bar, the attendees seemed willing to compromise. So BASA approved the application. The comedy club must still pass muster with the Full Board of CB6 on December 14 and, ultimately, the State Liquor Authority.
