ANNUAL MEETING

The 2014 Annual Meeting was held in June. Due to a quorum not being reached, we could not hold official elections. Good news: Our apartment values have risen 9.3% over 2012. The current board members have been reinstated for another year. It is important for ALL shareholders to fill out a proxy regardless of attendance next year.

FRONT DOOR SECURITY SYSTEM

The new key fob system allowing residents to open the front door late at night in the event



the doorman steps away from the door is nearly complete. The fobs will only open the East door from the outside when it is locked, but can exit the building by the East door by pushing it open.

The door will automatically close and lock when we enter or leave. Each household will be given two fobs. Lost or additional fobs will be available at \$50 each.

SIDE GATE SECURITY SYSTEM

The side yard gate has been secured with a video

intercom system that allows the doorman to see who is at the gate, and buzz them in. The gate will also close and lock automatically.

ROOF DECK

Residents are enjoying our splendid roof deck this summer. However, there have been several problems we need to address.

- 1. People are leaving a mess on the furniture and deck. CLEAN UP AFTER YOURSELVES!
- 2. People are using the parapet walls to place glasses and dishes, which can fall onto the street and terraces, causing injury. **DO NOT PLACE ANYTHING WHATSOEVER ON THE PARAPET WALLS, IN OR ON the PLANTERS!**
- 3. Cigarettes are being thrown off the roof onto people's terraces. A resident's chair was burned through the cushion down to the frame. **USE THE ASHTRAYS AND SEE THAT YOUR GUESTS DO THE SAME!**



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A new rule is in effect:

Parties of <u>NO MORE THAN 10 PEOPLE</u> WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE ROOF AT ANY TIME.

Management will be resending the updated Roof Deck Rules to everyone shortly.

ROOF DECK FURNITURE

There has been a lot of rearranging of the furniture on the roof. Every day, the staff has to move it back where it belongs. **Please leave the furniture where it is.** It makes a lot of noise to downstairs neighbors, puts wear and tear on the roof, and makes a mess. Those who continue to rearrange things will be contacted by management.

Please be considerate of your downstairs neighbors and keep noise to a minimum. If you smoke, use the ashtrays, not the deck itself, or allow anyone to throw their butts over the walls! Do not put anything whatsoever on the parapet walls or planter boxes.

COMPACTOR ROOM

The misuse of the compactors is a serious building-wide issue. Some residents are throwing large items, cardboard, appliances and other hazardous things down the chute, causing major problems and damage to the chute. ANYTHING other than bags of trash, securely tied, must be brought to the basement to be disposed of.

People are also still leaving their cardboard and garbage on the compactor floor. Please read the instructions and obey the rules. **DO NOT LEAVE YOUR GARBAGE ON THE FLOOR. BRING IT TO THE BASEMENT.** Those who continue to leave their garbage will be contacted by management.

ITEMS LEFT IN THE HALLWAYS

There has been an increase in residents leaving items in the hallways, such as strollers, toys, umbrellas, etc. This is strictly prohibited by Fire department Code and the House Rules. **DO NOT LEAVE ANYTHING IN THE HALLWAYS OR USE THEM AS A STORAGE AREA.**
